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Paulette Weinfurter gave the Clerk's report. The town has not received the written road use agreement or confirmation that they roads were logged before M&J Electric started using them for the X43 transmission line. The board needs to schedule a closed session regarding the Road Crew wages for the rest of 2022 and the 2023-2024 contract. The town also needs to let Tech Pros know where they can place the sound system for the Town Hall. The email addresses that he set up for the Town Board are still active.

Billie-Jo Kester provided the Treasurer's report. Roger Wilcox was able to speak with Robb Sigler at the Nekoosa Bank. Billie-Jo was given the ability to move forward with the securities.

Rhonda Carrell was in contact with Andy Simon from the Grand Rapids Fire Department regarding the fire contract. This will be reviewed in the next 4-6 weeks.

McDonald made a motion to approve the minutes with corrections. Kretschmer seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

McDonald made a motion to approve the June 15th minutes amendment. Leichtnam seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Leichtnam made a motion to approve the business permit for Earl Stoflet. Grumpy's Garage, 10720 State Highway 13 South. Kretschmer seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Alliant Energy submitted three sign permits. Raymond Bossert stated the signs meet the sign ordinance requirements in the town. Kretschmer made a motion to approve the sign permits. Wilcox seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

There was a brief discussion with the current Deputy Clerk regarding the Clerk vacancy. Kretschmer made a motion to have Paulette Weinfurter fill out the remainder of the Clerk position effective August 15, 2022. Leichtnam seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

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Kretschmer made a motion to name the Nepco Lake Public Access going forward as Turtle Bay Public Access. Wilcox seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

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There was discussion outlining the steps needed when considering an intersection be changed to a four-way stop. Leichtnam made a motion to adopt the draft "Stop Sign" policy as presented. McDonald seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Brief discussion ensued regarding mediation costs and considerations and how it may help. Helen Legare, a Saratoga resident, will be attending the meeting on August 17, 2022 to share the services she is able to offer.

Leichtnam made a motion to adjourn. McDonald seconded it. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 9:50 pm.

The Saratoga Town Board met at 6:00 pm in the Town Board room. Chairman Carrell called the meeting to order. All board members were present. The meeting was officially noticed August 1, 2022.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Steven Jaecks and Karen Potter-Jaecks provided the town with an affidavit regarding the challenges they have encountered over the last couple years trying to access their land locked property. The town's attorney, Larry Konopacki, provided assistance via phone. Mr. Jaecks will reach out in writing to the neighboring property to see if they can reach an agreement. Kretschmer made a motion to get estimates for gravel road extension for ¼ mile from Beppler Road to Jaecks property line. Estimate to include legal fees. McDonald seconded it. Motion passed unanimously. Road Oversight Manager Passineau was going to look into the cost of the extension.

No public comment at this time.

The Constable and Building Inspector were absent.

Raymond Bossert gave the Zoning Administrator report. There have been no new certified survey maps. Ray is still working with the Plan Commission on getting the ordinance up to speed with zoning changes. He prepared a survey that will help get a better understanding for what the residents of Saratoga are wanting.

Rick Nowicki provided the Wood County Solar update. They have had lots of activity on the East side. The hot commissioning was finished and power is being put on the grid. Currently 13 inverters are producing power. Mid to end of October, is the target date for the site to be operational. Mr. Nowicki also spoke with Alliant Energy about a viewing platform, but they do not want to take on the liability.

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
